In English, "it's raining cats and dogs" means "it's raining a lot". But can animals really rain from the sky? Actually, yes. For example, on Tuesday, 8 August 2000, in the town of Great Yarmouth, England, hundreds of fish rained down from the sky. Four years later, on 18 August 2004, the same thing happened in Knighton, a town in Wales. According to the Bible, a storm of frogs fell on Egypt thousands of years ago, and later, in the 1st century AD, the Roman writer Pliny the Elder wrote about both storms of frogs and storms of fish. Croydon, a London suburb, experienced a rain of frogs in March 1998. But don't worry, there is a scientific explanation for these strange things: in a strong storm near water, wind can sometimes pull fish or frogs out of the water, carry them in the air, and then drop them on the ground. Great Yarmouth is next to the North Sea, and Knighton is on the River Teme: this explains the fish there. Croydon is a long distance from London's River Thames, but strong winds can carry the animals very far. Sometimes, the high sky's cold air can freeze the animals before it drops them: in Vicksburg, USA, in 1930, a turtle fell to the ground inside a block of ice. Storms sometimes pick up land animals, too, but cats and dogs do not rain as often as fish, frogs, and turtles.
