## 1 Information about the author

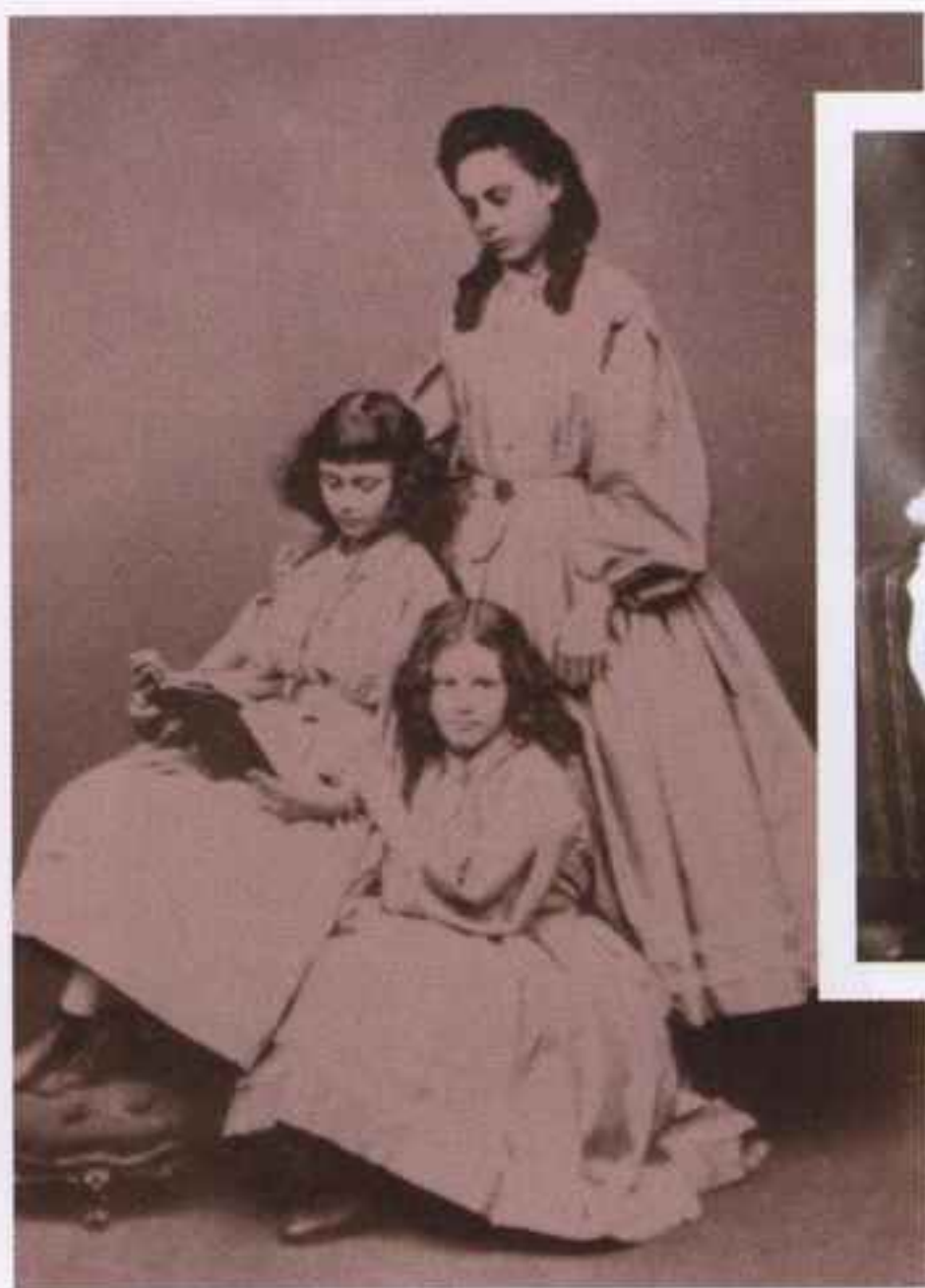
Hello, my name is Lewis Carroll. Well, my real name is Charles Lutwidge Dodgson but when I write my stories I prefer Carroll, the Latin for Charles. What about Lewis?... Well, that comes from Lutwidge, my mother's surname.

I was born in 1832 in a village called Daresbury in Cheshire. I have got eleven brothers and sisters. My father's name is Charles Dodgson and my mother's name is Jane Lutwidge. As a child, I loved mathematics and games and writing, too. I wrote magazines for my brothers and sisters. In 1846 I went to secondary school to Rugby<sup>1</sup> where I won prizes in Classics, Divinity<sup>2</sup> and Mathematics. When I was nineteen I went to Oxford. I became a teacher at Christ Church<sup>3</sup> at the age of twenty-one. I gave maths lessons and wrote about local political matters.
